



## West Virginia Children's Health Insurance Program (WVCHIP)

WVCHIP is a low cost health care plan for children and teenagers of working families. There is no cost to apply. WVCHIP covers services important to growing children, such as check-ups, vision and dental services, immunizations, hospital visits, prescription drugs, and more.

### Who Qualifies for WVCHIP?

- ◆ **Age**—Children under age 19.
- ◆ **Income**—Qualifying income is based on the family's monthly or yearly gross income (before taxes) and family size. A family consists of a child or children and their natural or adoptive parents living together in the same home. (Step-parents and grandparents in the home are not counted, unless they have adopted the child.) Expectant children can be applied to the family size.

**Co-Payments**—WVCHIP Gold and Blue groups do not have co-pays on preventive care, dental, vision, or generic prescriptions. WVCHIP Blue and the Premium Plan will be responsible for co-pays on inpatient services, outpatient procedures, non-well visits, and emergency room visits. Premium members also have co-payments for some dental services. All members will be subject to a co-pay on brand name prescriptions. Co-payments will be required until maximum limit has been met for the year. Premium Plan members also have low monthly premiums in addition to required co-payments. - ◆ **Insurance**—If your child is covered by another health insurance plan, or was covered at any time during the past three months, the child may not be eligible.
